

## GROLIER LANDS AND PEOPLE

Lands and People is a fun and educational encyclopedia of countries, cultures, and current events. Each article describes a country's land, people, economy, history, and government. Check out the current news stories, atlas, and educational games including puzzles and brain tease.

### How do I log in?

Visit the Encyclopedias for Kids web page at [www.stratford.library.on.ca/kids/databases.htm](http://www.stratford.library.on.ca/kids/databases.htm). Scroll down until to the **Grolier Lands and People** section and click on where you are – in the library or outside the library. If you are at home, you will be asked to type in your library card number – remember no spaces!

The Lands and People feature allows you to:

- Browse an **Encyclopedia**
- Read a **Global News Desk**
- Browse an **Electronic Atlas** to see maps on various topics (precipitation, temperature, etc.) and areas.
- Search a whole section devoted to North America (**Focus: North America**)
- Compare countries in **Culture Cross**
- Play games under **Passport Fun**
- Search an **Almanac** for facts and figures, flags, and other items of interest

### Encyclopedia

When you click on Encyclopedia, a new screen will appear and along the left will be a listing of different areas of the world. Click on an area, a new screen will load and show information on that part of the world – as well as a new menu on the left will appear with countries in that part of the world. Click on the country as needed. With each country there will be buttons on the right hand side of the screen which will allow you to access their flag, a map, facts and figures, and a sidebar that highlights a neat fact or two about your country.

### Culture Cross

With this feature you can compare two countries from around the world. You can compare landscapes, people, economy, history and facts and figures of the two countries that you choose. They will appear side by side in a new window. Each country will have their own scroll bar so remember to use them!

### Bibliographies

Do you need this source to be put in a bibliography? At the beginning of each article there will be a **How to Cite This Article** hyperlink. Click there to see the bibliography information for that webpage.

### To Print or E-mail an Article

Click on the **Print/E-mail** icon on the left of the screen and follow the instructions provided.
